



Reading Activities



- After you have read your book or a chapter from your book ask your parents to ask you some questions from the book mark given in the Summer term 2015.
- Make your own version of a book but change the characters.
- Design a poster for the book.
- Make/design a costume for one of the characters.
- Choose a character from the book, pretend it's their birthday and make them a card.
- Identify the problem in the book, how could the character/s solve the problem in a different way? Write a letter to the character to explain.
- Ask your parent or carer to give you a newspaper article cut into paragraphs. Can you read it carefully and try and put the paragraphs in order?
- Are you going on holiday? Using the internet or library to research the place and find out what there is to do there.
- Keep a list of any unfamiliar words or unusual description you read. Find out what they mean and keep them in a word bank. Can you use these in your writing?



Writing Activities



- Research something you are currently learning about at school and create your own fact file.
- Think about the story you are currently reading. Can you make up your own story that is similar but change the characters, setting or problem they face? Make a book and share it with your friends.
- Write a letter to family member or a friend...it's nice to receive a letter in the post instead of an email.
- Design a poster about any up coming events that will be happening at the school.
- Write a letter to Emu. He does like to read all your letters!
- Write to your School Council representative giving them ideas on ways to make the school even better.
- Create a fact file on your favourite animal (size, habitat, diet).
- Keep a diary, similar to the diary you kept over the summer holidays. What did you do on the weekend?
