This week we have been exploring the story *Halibut Jackson*. The children have really loved learning about costumes and special occasions that you might wear different outfits to. In Big Write they designed their own outfit and wrote about their chose of clothing for a special occasion.

In maths we have been developing our understanding of numbers to 10 and using practical methods to find different ways of making 10. In particular we have introduced the 'part-part -whole' method which they are really enjoying exploring in their play. We even had a 'making 10 challenge' which lots of the children have had a go at!



In phonics this week we have learnt the sounds ch, qu, th and ng. We have continued to practice recognising the 'tricky words' you, me, we and be.
