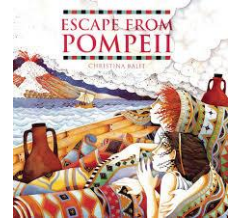

Our Learning Journey

This week in literacy we have started a new story, Escape from Pompeii. We have been focussing on creating noun phrases to describe scenes from our story, incorporating verbs and conjunctions to expand our noun phrases.

In maths this week, we have continued looking at time. We have learnt about am and pm and solved word problems in the context of time and finding the duration of various activities.



Our Home Learning

Reading: All children are expected to read at least 20 minutes a day. Please encourage them to read with you and engage them by asking questions about the text.

Spelling: Year 3 have been given new spellings to learn- they are expected to complete the sheets and the activity on the back.

Maths: We will be looking at length next week so it would be helpful for the children to practise measuring at home. If they have access to a ruler or a tape measure they could explore measuring everyday household objects and recording their length.

Learning Log: The children still have another week to complete their home learning task given to them last week. Please ensure that the children return their learning logs on Thursday 5th December.
