

Our Learning Journey

- This week Year 6 have been learning all about living things. We started off the week by learning all about microorganisms. We decided to carry out an investigation using bread to find out what conditions can cause mould to grow. The children observed the change of the bread that we had placed in different locations over the course of the week. They had to ensure that the investigation was fair so they thought carefully about the controlled variables and the independent variable. The children also consolidated their understanding of classifying animals, using the Linnaean system.
- In maths, the children have been consolidating their understanding of angles. After recapping prior knowledge about angles, the children explored a range of missing angle problems. They then focused on their protractor skills, ensuring that they were accurately measuring angles.
- In reading, we continued to read 'The Tiger Rising'. We focused on using our inference skills, using clues from the text to help us answer the questions.

Our Home Learning

- Reading: Year 6 should be spending at least 20 minutes per day reading.
- Spelling: The children have been given a spelling rule to learn. Please ensure this has been done and the activity has been completed to support their learning.
- Maths: This week we have been looking at angles. Look around your house and see how many different angles you can spot.
