Our Learning Journey this half term

We have focused on our geography skills throughout our Learning Journey this half term. We have named and located the countries and main cities of the United Kingdom. Also, we have studied a small area in the U.K, the New Forest, and identified the similarities and differences between human and physical geographical features. Linked to our literacy stimulus, we have also studied how volcanoes are formed and about their destructive power.

Holiday Home Learning

Our learning journey next half term is 'A Day in the Life of...', so the focus is on prominent figures in history and how they have helped to shape our future. Year 3 will be learning about Amelia Earhart, the most famous female aviator of the twentieth century, and Mary Anning, the renowned palaeontologist. We will also be learning about Bessie Coleman, the first African-American woman to hold a pilot licence. Children could investigate the history of aviation if they wish, in preparation for their topic next term.

The children should continue to read everyday and practise their times tables.
