Learning Journey: Survival

OUR LEARNING JOURNEY

- This week we continued to read 'The Promise' which explores the life of a young thief struggling to survive in her bleak and boring town. She attempts to steal from an old lady down a dark alleyway but is faced with a decision that she doesn't realise will change her life for the better. The children spent time exploring the change in mood throughout the text and picking out key themes. They created fronted adverbials using similes to help them paint a picture in their reader's mind. After finishing the book, the children planned and started to write their own sequels to 'The Promise', thinking carefully about the themes that they would need to include.
- In reading, we continued to read 'The Tiger Rising' which explores the capture of an endangered tiger. The children focused on making comparisons between the two main characters and discussed why they thought they behaved so differently.
- In maths, the children consolidated their understanding of plotting coordinates by solving a variety of reasoning style problems. They also applied their prior knowledge to translation and reflection questions too.

OUR HOME LEARNING

- To link with our whole school learning journey next term, the children have been asked to find out about their family history and create a family tree. As always, consider how you could be creative with your project.
- Continue to support your child in spending at least 20 minutes per day reading.
- Make sure your child is using their revision guides to support them in the months leading up to SATS. They are only 5 months away!
