Learning Journey: A day in the Life of...

Our Learning Journey

This week we have continued to learn about the Suffragette movement. The children learnt about how the Suffragettes were treated in prisons as a result of their fight for women's rights. The children wrote letters on behalf of the WSPU to Holloway prison in attempt to stop them from punishing women so severely for having a voice. The children used their planning tool to decide what they wanted to say and then used their empathy goggles to imagine how the women must have felt.

In History, the children made comparisons between the role of women over time. They then explored the role of women during the 1950s using a range of primary and secondary sources to help them understand how women were treated in the 50s.

In maths, the children were introduced to a new concept – ratio. We started the week by ensuring that they were using the appropriate language and vocabulary when exploring ratio, we then introduced the symbol that is used to represent ratio followed by consolidation of the methods and strategies that will help them. Children also applied the new knowledge that they had learnt to a range of reasoning style problems.

Next week the children will be completing some mock SATS tests. Please encourage your children to revise any topic areas that they may find challenging. We will share their results with you in the next parent learning reviews.

In addition, please ensure the spelling rule is learnt as well as completing the activity to support it. Ensure your child is reading for at least 20 minutes per day.
