Learning Journey: All the World's a Stage!

Our Learning Journey

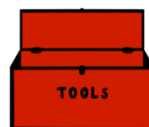
- Following on from our brilliant workshops at the Globe theatre last week, we continued to use drama techniques to explore plot and language aspects from *The Tempest*. Some children wrote poems based on Ariel's song and some wrote poems from Miranda's perspective. The children also had opportunities to develop their story-writing skills following two workshops from authors Vivian French and Andrew Clover. We also had a visit from author/illustrator Madga Bro!.
- In Maths, we used our reasoning skills to solve problems involving money. We practised making different amounts with 1p and 2p coins, and used our knowledge of doubling to in the context of money. We practised counting in 2s by counting 2p coins.
- In reading, we imagined what Cave Baby might be thinking and created freeze-frames to show his emotions.
- In phonics, we revised some of the more challenging phase 5 sounds, especially digraphs, and practised the phase 5 tricky words.
- In RE, we have been learning about Islam. We looked at how Muslims show that they belong to the community and why Muhammed is special to Muslims. We also handled some special objects including a prayer mat, a subha and a Qu'ran.

- Thank you for patience in allowing us to change the reading books on Monday instead of Friday, this is due to our school trip last week.
- Maths- practise counting out 1p and 2p coins, and if you can 5p and 10p coins too.
- You have another week to complete your learning log task.
