Our Learning Journey

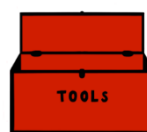
- In literacy this week, we have continued to read Julius Caesar, focussing on character descriptions. We have looked closely at two main characters, Brutus and Cassius, and tried to imagine what kind of characters they might be and what motivates them to do what they do.
- In maths this week, we have been practising telling the time, both analogue and digital, and explored am and pm, using context to decide which is appropriate.
- This half term we are learning about the Romans. The children greatly enjoyed learning about Roman gods and goddesses last week. This week, we learnt about the Roman invasions of Britain from 55BC to AD43, with the children making posters to show what they have learnt.

Home Learning

The children have been asked to research William Shakespeare to go compliment our Learning Journey, *All the World's a Stage*. They can research any aspect of Shakespeare's life and record their findings in whichever way works best for them. We would like them to return their learning logs by Thursday 12th March.

- All children are expected to read at least 20 minutes a day. Please encourage them to read with you and engage them by asking questions about the text.
- Year 3 have been given new spellings - please complete the sheets and the activity on the back.
- Children will need to practice their times tables and link the facts to division facts.
