## Our Learning Journey

- After a great trip to the Globe, we celebrated books this week through author visits and World Book day. Thank you to Vivian French for inspiring our story writing on Tuesday.

- We learned how to plan stories backwards this week, which let us plan collaboratively before setting off to tell the story of a witch who wants rid of her twitch.
- As theatres need sets, we have built prototype cams mechanisms to evaluate for our future project of building a model of a set design for the storm in King Lear. Like any prototype we found positives to keep and problems that need solving.
- In maths, we've been developing our abilities to tackle formal addition, subtraction, division and multiplication independently. There's been an uptick in our abilities to do so.



## Home Learning

Please, please, please, please read with your child and ask them to tell you the words from their texts that help them answer any of your questions. Great questions would be: -  
 How do/ does X feel? What words tell you this? (He is angry because he stomps off)  
 What was the story about? Why do you think this? (Families because the story talks about the relationships between brothers etc...)

Give your children multiplication and division problems to solve with you, but only multiply / divide 2-4-digit numbers by a single digit number (456x4 or 567÷7). A lot of the children still use multiplication squares to support them, so please keep using TT Rock Stars!
