Learning Journey: All the World's a Stage!

Our Learning Journey

- This week Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed delving further into our learning journey. In Literacy and Drama, we have focused on our class text 'The Tempest'. At the beginning of the week we looked the play and the characters. The children were able to use their making links tools to understand the strong relations between characters. In Drama, we used many of the techniques we practiced in the Globe theatre last week.
- In maths, all pupils consolidated their knowledge of multiplication using the long multiplication strategy. Later in the week they applied this skill and answered some tricky word problems which enabled them to use their reasoning tool.
- Over the last few weeks in reading, Year 5 have been enjoying the new class book 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl. The story is a mystery book set in the late 1800's but with futuristic features and characters. In the first few chapters we have been using our retrieval and inference skills to find out more about these characters.

Home Learning

- Over the next couple of weeks, the children have been asked to create their own play script inspired by Shakespeare. Encourage children to carry out research regarding the language commonly used in Shakespearean plays in attempt to make them as Shakespeare-like as possible!
- This week was a great opportunity to see how far pupils have come in their multiplications. Please encourage children to use their TTRS as those who practice regularly were much more confident in their learning.
- All children are expected to read for 20 minutes daily as it is proven to help them dramatically in all areas of their learning. Please spend some time reading out loud and asking questions about the text with your child.
