Learning Journey: All the World's a Stage!

Our Learning Journey

This week we have continued to learn about Shakespeare and our class play – Romeo and Juliet. The children created their own dialogue between Romeo and Mercutio, thinking carefully about how a character's actions can show how they are really feeling. This was further enhanced in our drama lessons; the children considered the body language and actions of Romeo when sneaking into the Capulet's ball.

In maths, the children spent time securing their knowledge of converting different units of measure and then applied these skills to a range of reasoning style problems.

Over the last couple of weeks in reading, we have focused on a different reading comprehension skill each week. This week we had a look at a range of different skills and considered how we could recognise different question types by the language included in the question.

Home Learning

Over the next couple of weeks, the children have been asked to create their own play script inspired by Shakespeare. Encourage children to carry out research regarding the language commonly used in Shakespearean plays in attempt to make them as Shakespeare-like as possible!

In addition, the children are expected to complete their spelling task as well as read for 20 minutes each day. Please encourage your children to use their revision guides to support any learning they have struggled with, the SATS are not far away!
